**SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY** – Congratulations! Couples must contact Father John at least six months in advance of desired date. Marriage Preparation is required for proper celebration of a valid and Sacramental marriage.

**PROSPECTIVE GODPARENTS/SPONSORS** asked to serve as Baptismal Godparents or Confirmation sponsor must request an eligibility certificate from the parish priest. To serve in this special role parishioners must: Be in full communion with the Catholic Church; Attend Mass weekly; have received Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, Reconciliation & Confirmation; Married individuals need be validly married in the Catholic Church. Please contact the Parish Office and allow 2 weeks to process.

HOMEBOUND - Parishioners homebound and unable to attend Mass please contact the Parish Office to arrange visitation, to receive Holy Communion

HOSPITALIZED - Call the Rectory to notify of someone in the hospital so we can pray for and possibly visit them. Each hospital in our Diocesan boundaries is either covered by a local parish or has a priest on call at the hospital.

# Mary, Mother of God

Mass 10a, January 01, 2024

The Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God falls exactly one week after Christmas, the end of the octave of Christmas. It is fitting to honor Mary as Mother of Jesus, following the birth of Christ. When Catholics celebrate the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God we are not only honoring Mary who was chosen among all women throughout history to bear

God incarnate, but we are also honoring our Lord, who is fully God and fully human. Calling Mary "mother of God" is the highest honor we can give Mary. Just as Christmas honors Jesus as the "Prince of Peace," the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God honors Mary as the "Queen of Peace." This solemnity of Mary, the patron Saint of the United States, falling on New Year's Day, is also designated the WORLD DAY OF PEACE



#### ABOUT THIS HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION

Under normal circumstances this Holy Day is also a Holy Day of obligation, meaning all Catholics are obligated to attend Mass. However, this Holy Day falls on a Monday this year. The Bishops of the US have ruled that when this day falls on a Monday the obligation is abrogated. Therefore, one is not obligated to attend Mass on Monday, January 1. That said, we will still have our parish Mass at 10a and we will still celebrate. What a beautiful way to start the new year, praying with Mary, the Mother of God!

#### **SCRIPTURE REFLECTION-** FATHER JOHN MARIA

Today, we celebrate the feast of the Holy Family. We honor Jesus, Mary and Joseph – this most holy of families that ever lived. This truth is profound, yet I worry that they are considered so holy that their example seems out of reach. We need to resist that temptation and ponder the reality of their everyday lives.

In our Gospel, we get a glimpse into the reality of the life of the Holy Family. Their lives were no fairy tale. Life in ordinary circumstances was hard – hand to mouth, a struggle. The Holy Family had to endure this every day. They also had the danger of an evil tyrant desiring to snuff out the life of the Newborn King.

We see the example of Mary and Joseph, tending to the harsh realities and demands of life, but knowing the primacy of God's plan in it all. In Mary, we see total cooperation with the grace of God. In Joseph, we see total reliance upon God's prompting. We see his absolute commitment to protecting the holy family from danger. These are bedrock lessons for all of us.

We are called, like Joseph, to reverence for the revealed truth of God, and to recognize the spiritual dangers to our families – not in desperate fear, but in a determined trust in the plan and mercy of God.

This week, let us entrust our families in a profound way to His love and mercy, and may we be inspired by the example of the Holy Family!

### **REFLECTION...** by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

Many items in our everyday lives follow a formula. The list would include everything from breakfast cereal to industrial chemicals. But the same holds true for our spiritual lives. Our Catholic prayers, for example, generally follow the "formula" or pattern of the "Our Father." We praise God and then make respectful request(s) of Him.

So too is there a formula for living family life as given to us in Holy Scripture. Today's Second Reading, of St. Paul to the Colossians, should rank high in our estimation. It is a direct refute of all the bullish attacks on Christian family life in the secular culture that surrounds us. The chief feature there is the absence of God and any reference to Him that is sadly prevalent in many families today.

The purpose of this particular letter was to bolster the faith of the community at Colossae and to correct errors reported about the Church in that city. Jewish and Hellenistic elements seem to be combined in those errors. Paganism, magic, astrology and mystery religions.

As we read the particular section of the Letter chosen for us on this special Feast of the Holy Family, we note the formula that emerges for living all our families in a truly Christian way. The basic component is the fact that we are "God's chosen ones." This means that God's existence as well as His presence are the essentials. Take God away and the whole formula is baseless. Note that "bearing with one another and forgiving one another" is included. How absent that seems to be many times these days!

Comedians make light of it, sometimes, but underneath the laughter is the sad kernel of truth that too many of us do not forgive and forget the mistakes of those people who have the same last name as ours.

We dare not push aside the Holy Family as our model because of the sublime holiness present there. If we are, as Paul tells us, "God's chosen ones," we have the inborn ability to honor God's choice by our prayer and daily effort.

The story is told of a young man who stood before a judge to be sentenced for forgery. The judge had been a friend of the boy's father, who was famous for his books on the law of trusts. "Young man." said the judge sternly, "do you remember your father, that father whom you have disgraced?"

"I remember him perfectly." the young man answered quietly.


"When I went to him for advice or companionship. He would say 'Run away, boy, I'm busy.' Well, my father finished his book, and here I am."
