

#### SCRIPTURE REFLECTION- DCN. NIKOLAI ROMERO

Many people are familiar with the story of the first reading from the book of Genesis, commonly known as the "binding of Isaac" or "God's test of Abraham." At God's request, Abraham takes his only son Isaac up the mountain in order to offer him as a sacrifice before the Lord. Many who hear this passage are often confused why a good and loving God would ask such a brutal thing of Abraham. Even if He plans to stop the sacrifice, it still seems like a cruel and cold-hearted test. Yet, for the Hebrew audience this reading expresses a deep and powerful love. For the Christian, too, it prefigures the greatest act of love to be revealed in Christ.

This passage shows a number of ways by which they are meant to respond to God. Abraham has received his son Isaac only by God's miraculous intervention. So, when he is asked to make a sacrifice of this beloved son, Abraham remembers that he is a gift from God. He cannot be possessive of this gift but must be willing to give it up. Abraham's actions demonstrate his true trust in God's goodness. If he doubted that God was good, he would have reason to believe that this request was evil. But Abraham does not doubt. Rather, by faithfully obeying the request, we see how firmly he trusts in God's goodness. He trusts not only that something good was to come from this instruction, but that the order itself must be good in some way.

Ultimately, this passage prefigures Jesus Christ, God's own beloved Son. Isaac foreshadows Jesus as he obeys the will of his father. In the end, neither story is a tragedy, but a tale of God's mercy and triumph over death. This Lent, we too can practice trustful obedience in God's plan. If we are willing to make sacrifices, He will work wonders for us and

RICEBOWL RECIPE FROM UGANDA: Matoke With Beans is an East African dish, popular in Uganda. It combines two staple ingredients: matoke—a type of banana—and beans, typically kidney beans or black-eyed peas. The dish is hearty, nutritious, and often enjoyed as a main course.

Start to finish: 45 minutes; Servings: 4

Ingredients

2 tablespoons oil

1 medium onion, chopped

2 garlic cloves, minced

1 teaspoon fresh ginger, grated

½ teaspoon cumin

4 green plantains or bananas, peeled/cut to 2" pieces

15-ounce can diced tomatoes

15-ounce can kidney beans, drained

½ cup vegetable stock

½ teaspoon chili flakes

Salt to taste

½ cup cilantro, chopped, for garnish

In a pot over medium heat, heat the oil and sauté the onion until it is translucent and soft, about 2 minutes. Add garlic, ginger and cumin. Stir for a minute or two until spices are fragrant. Add the bananas, diced tomatoes, kidney beans, vegetable stock and chili flakes. Salt to taste.

Cover the pot and bring to a boil. Reduce heat and let simmer for 25-30 minutes, or until the bananas are tender. Garnish with cilantro and serve immediately


KNOW THE FACTS - VOTER REGISTRATION IN PA: Are you registered to vote? If not, here's how. Check with your county voter registration office. The last day to register is usually a month before the election.

Individuals applying to register to vote must be:

- ✓ A citizen of the United States for at least one month before the next primary, special, municipal, or general election.
- ✓ A resident of Pennsylvania and the election district in which the individual desires to register and vote for at least 30 days before the next primary, special, municipal, or general election.
- ✓ At least 18 years of age on or before the day of the next primary, special, municipal, or general election.

REFLECTION... by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson Fathers and Sons. A unique dynamic. Psychologists have a field day explaining it. But even we non psychologists know that it is in contrast with the bond between fathers and daughters. It seems to me to be a straight bold line, as opposed to one softened with curlicues for the girls. At any rate, we somehow know this without ever being taught. We see it played out in the lives of our so-called "nuclear" or immediate families. It is in play in today's Scripture Readings for the Mass of the Second Sunday in Lent.

Today the Church presents us with one of the most endearing stories of the Old Testament, manifesting the love between father and son, Abraham, and Isaac. Oh, how Abraham the father must have been conflicted at first, but he knew that what God asked of him must be done. Obedience in the raw. But that very obedience so pleased God that a higher form of Divine Father and son took over. Abraham's reward would be numerous generations of sons and daughters in a chosen nation.

Fast forward through the ensuing centuries and we are allowed to share through Mark's writing under the Holy Spirit's guidance the spectacular transfiguration of Jesus of Nazareth to Son of the Most High, as the Archangel had described Him to His Mother Mary some thirty years prior.

Like Abraham on his mountain top, so Jesus on His, love between Father and Son is apparent. But this time there are five witnesses to it. Moses and Elijah, representing respectively the Old Testament Law and Prophecy now bear witness to someone who fulfills both. Peter, James and John, that favored trio of Jesus, look on baffled to see their Master in a new light, literally and figuratively. It will be in the category of something yet to come, also brought about by an incomparable obedience. The nails will be pounded in; the sword will pierce through, and no angel will stop the soldiers of Rome.

All of this puts our obligatory obedience to God in perspective. It provides not only motivation before it but a wonderful reward after it. This is why we choose our Lenten penances: we have not always obeyed God or done so grudgingly. Time for our conversion, don't you think?

One day a little boy was riding his tricycle around the block, over and over again. Finally, a policeman stopped and asked him why he was going around and around. The boy answered that he was running away from home. Then the policeman asked why he kept going around the block. Then the boy responded, "Because my dad said that I'm not allowed to cross the street." The point, I trust, is clear obedience will keep you close to those you love.
