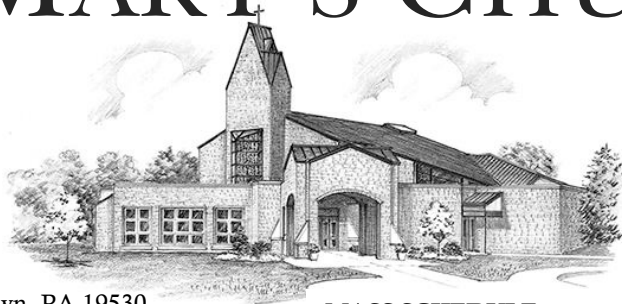

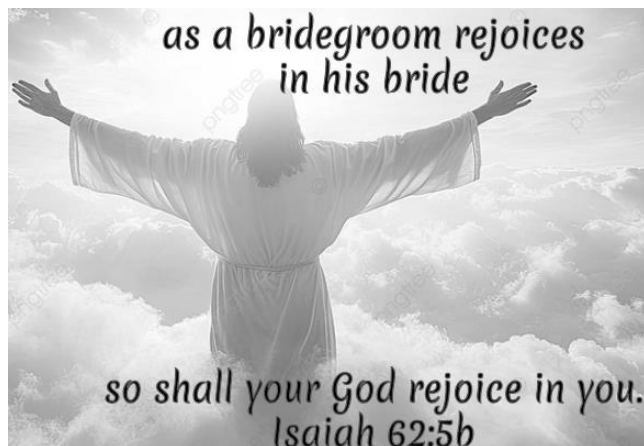

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY – Congratulations! Couples must contact Father John at least six months in advance of desired date. Marriage Preparation is required for proper celebration of a valid and Sacramental marriage.

PROSPECTIVE GODPARENTS/SPONSORS asked to serve as Baptismal Godparents or Confirmation sponsor must request an eligibility certificate from the parish priest. To serve in this special role parishioners must: Be in full communion with the Catholic Church; Attend Mass weekly; have received Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, Reconciliation & Confirmation; Married individuals need be validly married in the Catholic Church. Please contact the Parish Office and allow 2 weeks to process.

HOMEBOUND – Parishioners homebound and unable to attend Mass please contact the Parish Office to arrange visitation, to receive Holy Communion

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION- FR. JOHN MARIA

Our readings for the 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time provide a window into the love of God for His people. This week, the Lord presents to us the image of marriage.

The importance of marriage in God's plan runs through Scripture, from beginning to end -- from the Genesis account of Adam and Eve becoming one flesh to the Book of Revelation, where Heaven is described as the wedding feast of the Lamb: the union of Jesus and His Church, the Bride of Christ.

Our first reading from Isaiah describes the love of God for His people as that of a bridegroom rejoicing in his bride. This image is unlike any other religious notion of God! In our Gospel, we read of the miracle at wedding feast of Cana. It is no accident that the first miracle of the Lord's public ministry takes place at a wedding, at the intercession of His Mother Mary.

Let us pray for the renewal of the sanctity of marriage between husbands and wives. And let us pray that each of us, whether married or unmarried, may know the intimate love that God has for us! Mother Mary, pray for us!

Each year, the Holy Father asks for our prayers for a specific intention each month. You are invited to answer the Holy Father's request and to join with many people worldwide in praying for this intention each month.

For the right to an education: Let us pray for migrants, refugees, and those affected by war, that their right to an education, which is necessary to build a better world, might always be respected.

WORD OF LIFE: “There is such a wide spectrum of issues involving the protection of human life and the promotion of human dignity. Good people frequently disagree on which problems to address, which policies to adopt and how best to apply them. But for citizens and elected officials alike, the basic principle is simple: *We must begin with a commitment never to intentionally kill, or collude in the killing, of any innocent human life, no matter how broken, unformed, disabled or desperate that life may seem.* In other words, the choice of certain ways of acting is always and radically incompatible with the love of God and the dignity of the human person created in His image.” ~ *United States Conference of Catholic Bishops; “Living the Gospel of Life,”* © 1998 USCCB

About Ordinary Time:

Christmas Time and Easter Time highlight the central mysteries of the Paschal Mystery, namely, the incarnation, death on the cross, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus Christ, and the descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. The Sundays and weeks of Ordinary Time, on the other hand, take us through the life of Christ. This is the time of conversion. This is living the life of Christ.

Ordinary Time is a time for growth and maturation, a time in which the mystery of Christ is called to penetrate ever more deeply into history until all things are finally caught up in Christ. The goal, toward which all of history is directed, is represented by the final Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. (*United States Conference of Catholic Bishops*)

Why the word Ordinary? Ordinary, in this context, comes from the Latin term *ordinalis*, meaning ‘numbered’ or ‘ruled’. This title simply refers to the ongoing and rhythmical nature of the season. Just like everyday life, there is a rhythm to the days and the weeks. Sure, we have holidays and special occasions that we look forward to that change the pace, just like we have holy days and feasts in the Church year. But those special occasions aren’t the whole picture, just like there is more to the life of Christ than what we celebrate in other liturgical seasons.

When is the season? Technically, Ordinary Time has two parts, but it remains one season. The first part begins right after the feast of the Epiphany and runs until Shrove Tuesday, the day before Ash Wednesday (when Lent begins).

The second part begins the Monday after Pentecost and runs until the First Sunday of Advent. This part is typically about twice the length of the first.

REFLECTION... by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

At whatever age we may be, certain words set up a certain excitement within us. This certainly occurs when we hear “Once upon a time.” We “sit up,” as it were, and start to pay attention. The story may be familiar to us, and there is a special joy if we are about to tell someone else the tale for the first time.

Such is the case with the simple line that the author of the fourth gospel uses in our hearing this weekend: “There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee.” Most of us know what’s about to unfold and we line up the characters as we imagine them. A pair of newlyweds, perhaps having overspent on their reception, are about to be caught up in embarrassment because the wine is running out. In those ancient days, wedding celebrations ran for several days. Even the best planning might miscalculate how much wine the guests might consume.

The look of fear in their eyes gets noticed by one special guest. It is the Mother of Jesus, a close friend of the host family. She in turn puts her Son on notice with a simple statement: “They have no wine.”

We note some ambiguity in Jesus’ response, so mindful was He of His Father’s game plan for the timing of His earthly mission. This was paramount in all His own decisions. Mary might be upsetting things. Yet, there is that motherly power over a loving son, combined with a beautiful faith and trust, which finds her confidently telling the servers words that will turn out to be her valedictory address in all of Scripture: “Do whatever He tells you.”

Right then and there we have words to build a life on! Meanwhile the stewards brought the big stone jars of water forward, and when they were full of wine, it was a vintage with a taste that surprised the chief steward.

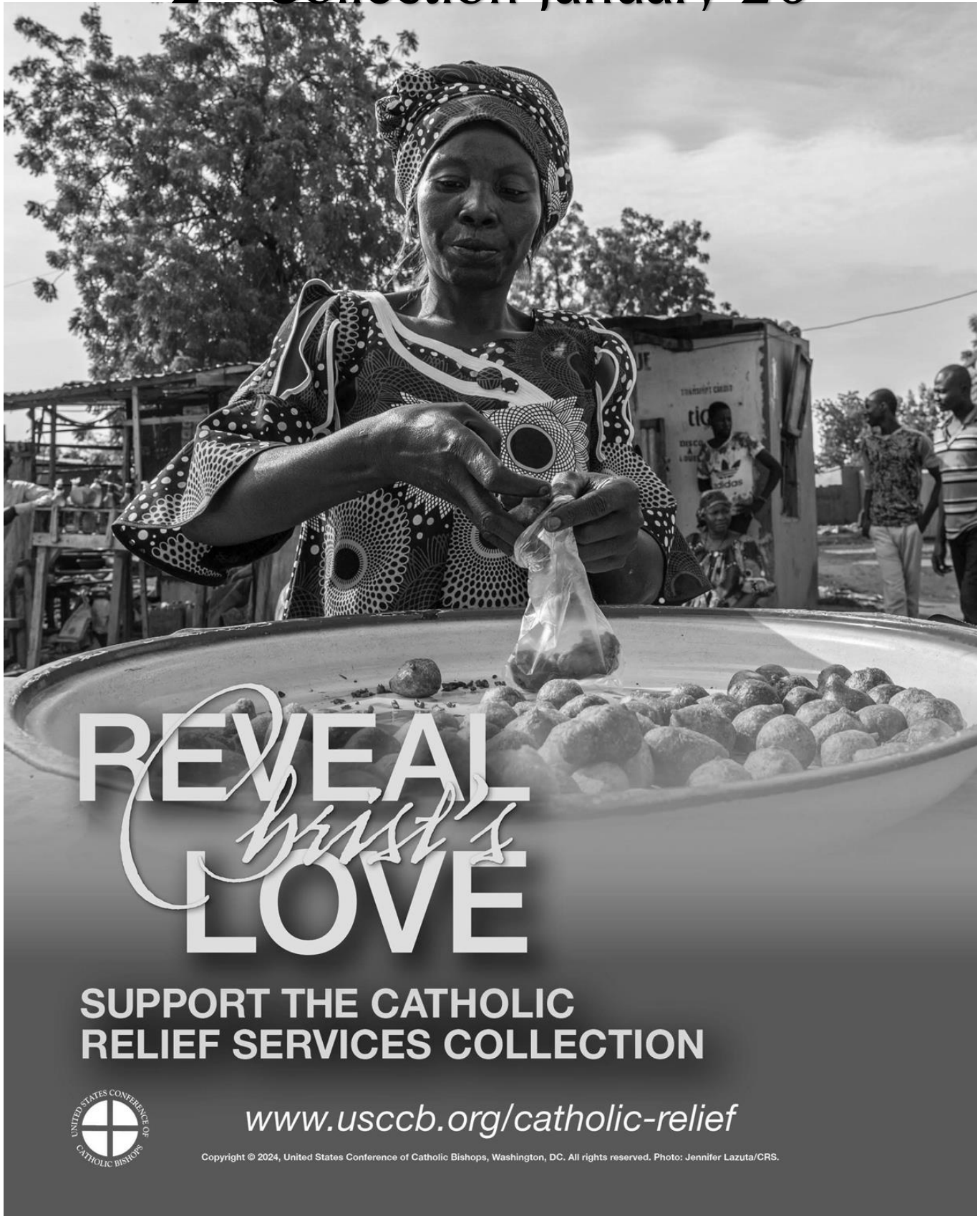
There are many possibilities for reflection in this beautiful story.

But I believe it is Mary’s command to the stewards that should be our takeaway. If only we could obey her words and do what Jesus wants of us 24/7/365! Not likely. But thanks be to God, we always have Mary’s help. And we also have the sacrament of Reconciliation with its fine-tuned graces.

Both will help us as our stories move along. For one day, we know not when, our stories will be a matter of “once upon a time.”
