

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION- FR. JOHN MARIA

Our readings for the 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time provide a sense of "new beginnings". This seems especially appropriate in this time of resolutions.

Our first reading from the Book of Nehemiah gives us a snapshot of one great new beginning for God's people in the Old Testament. It was around 450 BC. After the catastrophe of the destruction of Jerusalem and the Temple, the Jews were allowed to return home.

After decades of rebuilding, today's passage shows a time of rededication. While they recall their exile from the land, they also humbly realize a more profound exile—how far their hearts had wandered from God and His Word. When Scripture was read, they wept. Nehemiah encouraged them to not weep, but rejoice and praise God for that moment, and for His steadfast love for His people.

The Holy Father has also declared this Sunday to be "Sunday of the Word of God", a yearly reminder of the staggering importance of Scripture in our lives.

No matter how young or old you are, it's never too late for a new beginning in Christ. If you have been weak in your prayerful reading of Scripture, now is a great time to begin again!



2nd Collection this week



REFLECTION... by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson Ever noticed that when your doctor writes a new prescription for you that it is almost impossible to read? I often wonder if all medical professionals first attend a special school to learn how to do this. In addition, there is nothing added to what he or she writes so it is very specific. You might say it's blunt.

St. Luke was a doctor. While we don't have any handwriting samples of his, we cannot say his message is blunt. Just reading his telling of the Christmas story lets us experience his artistry with words. But in the passage from Luke chosen for today we note that Jesus is blunt in what He says. And for a reason.

To set the scene, we have Jesus back in His hometown, with all that implies. With His fame slowly growing, He has the chance to read the scroll in the same synagogue where He studied as a boy. The given passage is all about the coming Messiah. When He finished reading, He slowly rolled the scroll back, sat down and then declared: "Today this Scripture is fulfilled in your hearing."

What a statement! The attendees are momentarily shocked into silence, but quickly their sense of outrage takes over and they are angry at this apparent blasphemy in Jesus' blunt assertion. Hardly an occasion for applause, it quickly turns very ugly. While their reaction is not read to us here, we know that the crowd grabbed Jesus and with a mob mentality at work, they dragged him to the edge of the cliff on the hill the town sat on and tried to push Him over. Mob justice often leads to deadly violence.

For our purposes, we need to reflect on the blunt but accurate declaration about Himself that Jesus made. We know that often enough Our Lord's words were at times indirect or subtle, such as "The kingdom of God is like a mustard seed." At other times wonderfully consoling, like "Come to Me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will refresh you."

Here and now that startling declaration: "This passage is fulfilled in your hearing" is quite a contrast. But since Our Lord was truth itself, He cannot avoid the facts without betraying the truth.

The tenor of this last remark brings up the truth that sometimes we must be blunt with our interactions, especially with those we love. So, we have to say things like "You're drinking too much." Or "You drive too fast." "Your lying is going to get you in big trouble someday." More in a spiritual context: "You know missing Mass deliberately for no good reason is mortally sinful." "Pornography watching slowly becomes addictive." Blunt statements surely, we might define it as "tough love." But in the context, we began with here, perhaps it is "just what the doctor ordered." God love you and give you His peace.
