THE LORD CALLS EVERY SOUL TO KNOW HIS LOVE AND

MERCY. Each of us is called to strive to know Him in the *fullness* of Truth; not *settle* for partial truths, passing fads or imitations that won't satisfy our heart's longing.

He founded His Church upon the Rock of Peter to teach

<u>INVITE ONE BACK:</u> We can all pray for those who do not embrace the fullness of the faith, partake of God's mercy or the Blessed Sacrament. Pray for them, and for guidance in your relationships with them. It all begins with prayer.

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION- FATHER JOHN MARIA

Over the past weeks, we've seen the Lord displaying His power over nature, over evil, suffering and death. He is on a winning streak, until the events we read today for the 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time.

Jesus seems to have met His match. But it wasn't the forces of Satan that stymied Him. It was the neighbors of his hometown, whose familiarity with Him was an obstacle. He didn't meet the expectations they had. Their hearts were hard, and their faith was weak. This actually prevented Him from working miracles. NOT because He lacked the power, but because God has chosen to make His healing power contingent upon our faith.

If we're honest, we ought to acknowledge that we can also be familiar with Jesus, cherry-picking a few of our favorite traits, and then we fashion an image of Him. Today, Christ reminds us that He is calling us to faith in Him – the entire Christ - the Way, the Truth and the Life, before Whom all will bow in worship.

This calls us to humility. and to a faith that relies not upon our human wisdom or natural powers, but upon the grace of God. As Saint Paul was told when his own desires and prayers went seemingly unanswered: "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness."


This week, let us pray for this humility to seek Christ on His terms, and for the grace to respond with hearts open to being conformed to His Sacred Heart! MASSES FOR THE "PEOPLE OF THE PARISH": You may have noticed that frequently, the Mass intention is offered for the "People of the Parish". Some might speculate that this is used for an otherwise "unfilled slot", but that is not the case! By canon law, a pastor is obliged to apply a Mass for the people entrusted to him on each Sunday and holy day of obligation. There are some alternative options, but the norm is to have one weekend Mass reserved for this purpose.

It is also interesting that this applies to registered parishioners, and ALL those within territorial boundaries, whether Catholic or not. This is because a pastor has a certain spiritual responsibility for all souls within the parish territory.

Offering Mass "Pro Populo" ("for the people") is one of the ways a priest prays for all the intentions people have - a sick mother, a grieving widow, a wayward son, an unemployed husband, etc. Even if you have not asked, rest assured that your needs are being prayed for at Mass.

As each one has received a gift, use it to serve one another as good stewards of God's varied grace.

1 Peter 4:10.



BRETHREN OF JESUS In today's Gospel, the English translation of Mark 6:1-5 refers to "brothers and sisters of Jesus." Who are these people? This is often misunderstood and misinterpreted as evidence that the Blessed Mother had other children. Rest assured that this does not at all mean they were other children of Mary. In Hebrew and Aramaic (the language spoken by Jesus), there isn't a specific word for "cousin", so their word for "brother" or "brethren" was used more broadly to include other relatives. The Greek word "adelphos" used by St. Mark had a similar broad meaning. And so, this passage poses no problem for the Church's ancient teaching on the Perpetual Virginity of Mary. The teaching of the Catholic Church is fully rooted in Sacred Scripture! 

REFLECTION... by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

For centuries now the Church has acknowledged that St. Francis of Assisi is so much more than the model for a popular garden statue. In fact, he has been frequently described as "a second Christ" for his exemplary holiness. But like many a saint in the Church's official calendar, he did not have the support of his family for his choice of lifestyle. His own father disowned Francis in front of the whole town because he despised his son's decision.

In this instance Francis mirrored the rejection that Our Lord Jesus experienced from his own kinsmen as described in our Gospel episode from St. Mark today. Any of us who have felt a similar reaction to our lifestyle choices from our families can take comfort from Our Savior. So sad was he that He had to acknowledge that "No prophet has honor in his native place."

In a sense, this incident has echoes in the hostility a young man might experience in our selfish culture if he were to express a desire to become a priest. I know that sounds harsh, but it happens more than we know. The mother might argue: "No! Because I want grandchildren!" The father might say "No! I want you to work for my company!" From my limited perspective I believe such people will face a harsh judgment day with those attitudes

In another sense, I believe that this incident in Christ's life offers solace to all of us who want to stay loyal to Christ and His Church in our present society. A study of Church history will provide plenty examples of what Christ foretold when He said:" In the world you will have affliction." But then He added: "But take courage! I have overcome the world." That's where I place my hope, even though societal trends encourage the opposite. Just take the long and ongoing push in our country to legalize baby killing. Or to normalize unnatural concepts about marriage and gender.

We must concede that all of this is somehow part of God's master plan. His mysterious ways were manifest in the crucifixion of His Son for sure. But so was His glorious resurrection on the Third Day. So, we trust God in good times and in bad.

When Jesus announced the Eucharist, a very tough concept for a simple man like St. Peter. When Our Lord asked him "Are you too going to walk away, as did many early disciples, the humble St. Peter replied, "To whom shall we go? You have the words of everlasting life." So true! Still so!

Here are two homespun observations that make the point with a dash of sarcasm added: "If a person's character is to be smeared, there's nobody like a relative to do the job. Many people seem to think that distant relatives are the best kind to have."

God love you and give you the peace of St. Francis.
